In 2024 our specialist connected 2,212 individuals and families to vital help in 15 areas including disaster response, food, housing & utilities, legal aid & documents, mental health, and transportation.

Game Changer

Our Women United Community Allies and those who designated their donations to our Game Changer Fund allowed us to help 78 with birth certificates & ID's, 73 bus passes, 3 vital home repairs, and 176 utility/rent assistance. In 2024, with your contributions, we were able to move 7 families out of homelessness and into housing.

Reality Check Day



During the 2024-2025 school year 700+9th grade students participated in our financial readiness simulation over ten dates. Every school in our 4-county district participated, as well as the welcome addition of Clovis Christian Schools. Students learned how to budget not only their money but also their time. This was made possible by 74 volunteers giving over 550 hours and our Sponsors: Bank of Clovis, Citizens Bank of Clovis, Western Commerce Bank, JP Stone Community Bank, First Financial Credit Union, US Bank, American Heritage Bank, & Taco Box.

No Worries Wall

In 2024, we installed 19 additional No Worries Walls in all the elementary schools in 13 school districts: Clovis, Portales, Tucumcari, Dora, Elida, Floyd, Melrose, Texico, Ft. Sumner, Grady, House, San Jon, and Logan. That is in addition to the 33 already hanging in middle & high schools for a total of 52 personal care "Walls" supplying FREE hygiene items for students in need. 4-County Behavioral Health Partnership

Funded by a HRSA grant, UWENM is working with 12 school districts, mental health providers, detention centers, EPCOG, hospitals, colleges and universities, <u>UWENM is strengthening the mental and behavioral health environment for students and families.</u> 4CBHP is supporting social work students with **stipends**, adding professionals to rural schools and hospitals, covering costs of **training** for local



mental health providers & educators in Play Therapy, Mental Health First Aid, Resiliency, and Anti-Vaping, providing students with text based a positive psychology intervention program, conducting behavioral health symposiums for professionals & career days for high school students, and improving referral and client tracking for collaborating organizations.






Catch My Breath - Substance Use Campaign

A team from the National Guard partnered with our HRSA team to bring a Substance Use "Catch My Breath" Campaign to 4 of our Rural schools. Logan, Grady, San Jon, Tucumcari 6th-8th graders participated. Four sessions were held over the course of 4 months from February to May 2025. 258 students attended the sessions. 102 of them were 6th graders, 112 of them were 7th graders, and 44 of them were 8th graders. "Catch My Breath" is an anti-vaping program. 9 teachers and community members from each of our four counties also completed a training to further teach the program in our counties.











Community Conversations

Our 4 Community Conversations held in Curry, Quay, and Roosevelt Counties, April 8th - 11th, were attended by 36 people - 17 of those people participated in the additional sessions to become Facilitators.



Rural Schools Career Day

Our Career Day was attended by Dora, Fort Sumner, Elida, Logan, Grady, and San Jon. Involving only the 11th graders from the schools, there was a headcount of 81 students in attendance.











HRSA Symposium

Our HRSA Symposium held on November 15 at the Clovis Community College. had a total of 116 people attend. The Resiliency movie that was featured after lunch was attended by 33 people.
